

**Please Note:** As the infection metrics change within our WVC campuses or in Lancaster County, safety protocols will be reviewed and revised as needed.

**HEALTH SCREENING**

**INDEPENDENT LIVING**

Residents and visitors are encouraged to self-monitor for symptoms of illness. If respiratory or COVID-19 symptoms are present, then remain home to recover.

**SUPPORTIVE LIVING**

Screening is REQUIRED of all prior to entry into Supportive Living:

- A series of questions is asked
- A visitor badge is worn throughout the visit.
- The visitor or Team Member badge will display a colored dot of the day to indicate successful screening
- If screening is not successful, the visit will be postponed

**MASKING REQUIREMENTS**

**INDEPENDENT LIVING**

A mask is optional in most public locations. Masking is a good infection prevention measure, offering protection against the spread of respiratory illnesses.

**A mask is NEEDED when:**

- Symptoms of a respiratory illnesses are present
- Following recovery of a respiratory illness, when mild symptoms linger

**A mask is REQUIRED when:**

- Using WVC transportation for an extended time period (greater than one hour). Mask requirement will be announced in advance of the trip
- Using public transportation during all WVC sponsored trips
- When using The Glen 3rd floor connector (the corridor is part of Supportive Living)
- Attending Cultural Center Renaissance evening theater events
- Attending large WVC scheduled gatherings. When applicable, a mask requirement will be announced in advance or offered at entry

**SUPPORTIVE LIVING**

Masking is REQUIRED for everyone while in the Supportive Living areas when:

- Community transmission level is high
- There is an outbreak of infection cases
- Visiting a Resident who is experiencing a contagious illness

Mask requirement updates will be announced via signs posted in the SL buildings.

When all criteria are met, then a mask may be optional.

**VISITATION**

**INDEPENDENT LIVING**

Visitors are welcome on our campuses. Please encourage visitors to postpone their visit when they are not feeling well, or after a known high risk exposure to someone that is ill.

**SUPPORTIVE LIVING**

Visitors are permitted after completion of successful screening. Visitors experience greater risk of exposure to illness when they choose to visit a Resident that is ill or during an outbreak. Personal protective equipment will be required during periods of increased risk.

**COVID-19 TESTING**

**INDEPENDENT LIVING**

Testing is available at the Mylin House when asymptomatic and from Resident Nursing if symptoms are present. Testing Center hours are posted on the Resident Intranet.

**SUPPORTIVE LIVING**

Testing continues per regulations.

**TRAVEL GUIDANCE**

**Travel increases the risk of exposure to viruses.** Consider additional prevention measures to protect yourself and others, especially those with immune compromise. Prevention may include being up-to-date with your COVID-19 and influenza vaccinations offers increased protection against viral illness. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends wearing a “high-quality mask or respirator over the nose and mouth” during use of public transportation, such as on an airplane, bus, or train.

Following **International Travel**, you should:

- Get tested 3-5 after your return to the U.S. Testing is available to Residents at the Mylin House; refer to the Resident Intranet for the testing schedule
- Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms daily for at least ten days. If symptoms occur, then get tested

Following **Domestic Travel**, you should:

- Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms daily for at least ten days. If symptoms occur, then get tested
- If your travel involved situations of greater risk exposure, then test 3-5 days after the high risk exposure or upon your return

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
